Clyde in the Classroom

Our Primary 7 classes visited the Science Centre this week for the launch of their 'Clyde in the Classroom' project. Clyde in the Classroom is a hands-on project which uses the life history of a native Scottish species, the brown trout, to promote awareness of river ecology among young people across the River Clyde catchment. The project is delivered by the <u>Clyde River Foundation</u> and is a great basis for outdoor learning and STEM education. The project encourages children to engage with nature and develop a sense of pride in their local environment. The children are responsible for the care of brown trout within their classroom and work weekly with <u>Clyde River Foundation</u> Scientists. We can't wait to see how they get on with this fantastic project.

<u>PE</u>

Glasgow City Council guidelines state that **"It is important that pupils come prepared to learn and for PE this requires appropriate clothing. All jewellery should be removed."** If your child has their ears pierced please either remove their earrings on the days they have PE (or a sporting club) or ensure that they are able to do this for themselves. Staff are not normally able to assist with the removal and insertion of earrings. Unfortunately, taping over earrings does not provide the same degree of protection as removal.

If you are unsure about which days your child has PE, please check with us as we'll be very happy to let you know.
