Maths and Numeracy

This term we will continue to develop our number skills through a Concrete, Pictorial, Abstract (CPA)

approach. Particularly focusing on comparison of numbers and number sequences. We will continue to develop our understanding of the four operations (+ - × ÷) and the relationships between them.

Additionally, we will be looking at 2D shapes and 3D objects, our identifying of more complex shapes and the development our language of description. We will also look at measurement (mm, cm, m) and area.
