in the way we interact with them. Recently, we have been made aware of some concerns regarding littering within the community, and want to do our utmost as a school to ensure we play our part in keeping the local streets clean and tidy; for instance, we have recently had groups of young people undertake litter-picks in the local streets. We will continue to promote the importance of Respect within the community at assemblies, and would be appreciative if you could reinforce this message to your child/children where necessary.

Pupil Return on Monday the 6th of January

I hope our pupils return to school feeling refreshed on Monday the 6th of January, 2025 at 8.50am. We continue to promote high expectations through our school policies and routines, and these reflect our school values of Belonging, Aspiration, Growth, Achievement and Respect. I have copied some of these (our OPENS classroom routine, our Uniform Policy and our Attendance Policy) at the end of this letter. The key messages are:

- Pupils should attend school and arrive at all lessons on time;
- Pupils should attend school each day with a fully-charged iPad, and with the other materials they will need to engage properly with their learning;
- Pupils should be mindful of school rules in relation to mobile phones and other devices;
- Pupils should be in full school uniform when attending school.

There has been an improvement in the number of young people wearing full school uniform (particularly in S1-S2, and in S6) and I am grateful to parents/carers for their support in this matter; we believe that uniform is important in promoting equality and a sense of belonging. Some young people, however, are continuing to wear jogging trousers, leggings, or other items of sportswear, and these are not uniform items. Even if they are timetabled to be in P.E. for period 1, pupils should arrive at school in uniform.

If the purchasing of uniform items may cause financial difficulty for our families, I would encourage parents/carers to get in touch with Sharon Graham, our Financial Inclusion Support Officer (0141 773 5850) to see if any support may be accessed, or to make use of our Blazing Squad initiative, where uniform items can be borrowed. Ms Gibson and Ms Mohammed in the Faulty of Technologies are the main points of contact for this. If you are able to donate any school uniform items you no longer require to our Blazing Squad initiative, these will be gratefully received.

I hope that our pupils and their families are able to enjoy a restful break over the next few weeks. To those within our school community who celebrate it, I wish you a very merry Christmas, and hope that all of our young people and their families enjoy a happy and New Year in 2025.

Our LEARN policy's focus on ROUTINES in LEARNING means that these expectations are consistent in every lesson.






