Start of New Term

During our extended Tutor Time this morning, all pupils were reminded of school standards and expectations. The key points to note are:

- Pupils should attend school and arrive at all lessons including Tutor Time on time;
- Pupils should attend school each day with a fully-charged iPad (these will be issued to new S1 pupils early in the session), and with the other materials they will need to engage properly with their learning;
- Pupils should be mindful of school rules in relation to mobile phones and earphones;
- Pupils should be in full school uniform when attending school;
- S1-S3 pupils are not permitted to leave the school premises at morning interval;
- S1 pupils should also stay on the school premises at lunchtime.

We greatly appreciate the support we receive from parents/carers in ensuring these expectations are met. For instance, uniform standards today are outstanding, and it is very pleasing to see our young people identify themselves as proud Bellahouston Academy pupils in this way.








Each Bellahouston Academy lesson begins with a reminder that the key to a positive lesson is how it **OPENS**:


