Priority 1: Raise attainment in Literacy and Numeracy	
Improvement Focus	Targets
Planning, and Tracking Children's Progress	 Update curriculum planning to align with national Benchmarks and new Glasgow frameworks. Develop and implement a web-based tool to support teachers monitor and track children's progress. Strengthen moderation activity to help teachers achieve shared standards and expectations for learning.
Numeracy Teaching and Learning	 Training and development to enhance staff skills and confidence teaching numeracy. All teachers use the new <i>Glasgow Counts</i> framework to help achieve consistency across the school and city, and to support tracking, planning, transitions and effective teaching and learning. Deliver family learning sessions to help parents and carers support their children's numeracy skills.
Spelling Teaching and Learning	 Review and update our spelling policy and practice. Training and development to enhance staff skills and confidence teaching spelling. Deliver family learning sessions to help parents and carers support their children's spelling skills.
Targeted Support and Interventions	 Use our Pupil Equity Funding to provide additional targeted support and interventions for children from lower income families to help them achieve at the highest level possible.
Reading for Enjoyment	 Create a central library and enhance class libraries to promote children's reading for enjoyment.
Priority 2: Improve Health & Wellbeing and Support Inclusion	
Improvement focus	Targets
Promoting Positive Behaviour and Relationships	 Update our Anti-bullying and Equalities policies and practice in line with recent local authority guidance. Use restorative conversations to help children resolve conflict and repair relationships.
Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood Education (RSHPE)	 Staff training and development to support implementation of the new national RSHPE programme. Deliver family learning sessions to help parents and carers support their children with RSHPE.

 Use new audit tool to identify where we can improve our support for children who have been, or who are currently in care.

Active Play and Physical Literacy



- Training to enable teachers and support staff to continue with Go2Play at the end of the pilot.
- Fund a playground Trim Trail to provide enhanced opportunities for outdoor play.

- Training and development, including Apple Teacher, to enhance staff skills and confidence delivering Glasgow's digital learning strategy.
- Deploy iPad devices at a ratio of one for every five pupils in P1-5 and one each for P6-7 pupils.
- Explore use of Showbie app to create and share children's learning portfolios.
- Deliver family learning sessions to help parents support their child's digital learning and online safety.
- Develop and launch a new school website.

Play Based Learning



- Further develop our approaches to play based learning in P1. Introduce in P2.
- Develop use of our open areas and playground environment for play based learning.

Modern Language Learning



Expand the Mandarin outreach programme across P5-7 classes in partnership with The Swire Chinese Language Centre in Jordanhill School.

Deliver a family learning session to help P6 parents support their child's modern language learning.

Music Tylition



- Explore sustainable ways of expanding vocal and instrumental music within school hours and through out-of-school-hours clubs and activities.
- Signpost children to CREATE music opportunities available across the city.

Developing the Young Workforce (DYW)



- Expand opportunities for P1-3 children to develop knowledge of work through play and P4-7 children to develop skills for enterprise and employability.
- Support P5-7 use My World of Work online resource to explore their strengths, goals and career options.
- Signpost My Kid's Career website to help parents engage with their children about career options.
- Strengthen work with business partners/employers to co-design and deliver DYW opportunities.
