

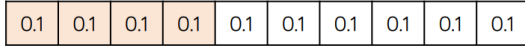

The table shows the ages of people in a theme park.

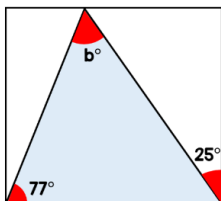

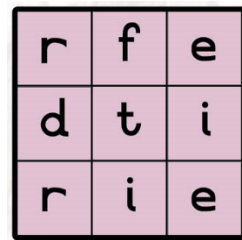
Spelling
