Literacy and Languages



- Writing: Recounts (develop skills in structuring, language and layout). Reports and story writing will be linked to topic work. Focus on spelling rules, active strategies in class and at homework.
- **Listening and Talking:** Preparation and presentation of short talks related to hobbies and interests, group/ class discussions and group presentations linked to our Rainforest topic.
- **Reading:** Develop skills in using a variety of during and after reading strategies to develop comprehension. Using library books to develop reading for enjoyment. Reading for information skills related to topic work. Group novels include The BFG by Roald Dahl, The Iron Man by Ted Hughes, Code X and Dandelion group readers.
- French: Greetings, Register, Date, Weather, Birthdays, Praising Language, Countries, Nationalities and use of third person.

Mathematics and Numeracy



- **Number Talks** to develop understanding of concept and mental agility.
- Place Value (Making numbers using concrete, pictorial and written representations. Develop skills in partitioning, ordering, mentally increasing / decreasing 2 or 3 or 4 or 5-7 digit numbers by10,100,1000 and 10 000.)
- Develop skills Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division using a variety of strategies.
- Fractions, Decimals and Percentages
- Information Handling
- **Developing skills in Problem Solving and Enquiry strategies** N.B. Work will be differentiated to meet the needs of pupils.

Social Studies, Science and Technologies

Tropical Rainforests

- Discussion in groups and class about what is a Tropical Rainforest, drawing diagrams labelling layers and writing notes on layers of the Rainforest. **Discussing** the causes and consequences of deforestation, investigating regeneration projects, planting, environmental and conservation issues. Discuss ways of helping the Tropical Rainforest -Action Plan
- Develop mapping skills in locating where Tropical Rainforests are found.
- Researching using digital technologies and presenting information in groups or as short talks about a Rainforest animal of choice, endangered species, food and medicine from the Tropical Rainforest. Writing persuasive texts and letters.
- Investigate Peoples of the Tropical Rainforest. How has technology affected lives of people? What dangers do they face? (Use of digital technology and websites such as WWF, Nrichmaths.org, Topmarks, Education City as well as Sumdog Challenges to motivate learners.)

Humanism -Term 1 (Pupils will focus on learning to discuss the influence of religion on people's lives. Pupils will be learning about the thoughts and beliefs of Humanists.)

Expressive Arts (Art and Design, Music, Drama and Dance)

Drama: Developing skills in role play, expressive use of voice and creating short role play scenarios.

Music: Music Appreciation: Listening to music inspired by the beauty of nature. Discussions of feelings evoked and pupils provided with the opportunity to share and discuss own music that inspires.

Art: Pupils will develop skills in observational drawing, painting and collage linked to our Rainforest topic as well as creating portraits of our peers. Pupils will be creating leaves, vines, trees, plants, animals for wall frieze. Pupils will be learning about the work of Henri Rousseau inspired by the natural world.
