Literacy and Languages



Reading – Novels including *The Back of The Class* by Onjali Q. Rauf. Various comprehension activities linked to current affairs and social studies.

<u>Writing</u> – Poetry (examining and developing descriptive techniques such as metaphor and simile), report writing. Focus on spelling of high frequency/topic related words and proof-reading and editing skills.

<u>Talking and Listening</u> – volume, speed and eye contact in delivering short speeches. Listening skills will also be taught and discussed. Individual presentations related to interests and hobbies, debate skills and note-taking.

Mathematics and Numeracy



- Revision and developing understanding of place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.
- Fractions, decimal and percentages; fractions/percentages of amounts, equivalence, simplification, working with decimals.
- Improving speed and refining strategies used in mental calculations through relevant contexts and Sumdog.
- Continuing development of problem solving skills throughout numeracy and mathematics, introducing and developing various strategies.

Social Studies, Science and Technologies

Renewable Energies

- Developing an understanding of the differences between renewable and non-renewable energy sources
- Researching and presenting information through a written report about the pros and cons of renewable energy sources such as the sun, wind and air
- Enhancing their understanding of Scotland's landscape and our position in the world as a leader of renewable energy initiatives
- Discussion and learning about Cop26

Health and Wellbeing (Including P.E.)



Pupils will consider their own responsibilities and actions as they mature, along with looking to increase their own self-confidence. PATHS lessons and discussions promoting social, emotional, and mental well-being.

Team sports with a focus on endurance, teamwork, and co-ordination; Ultimate Frisbee, Capture the Flag, Netball.

<u>Morality</u>

What do you stand for? Recognising and discussing personal opinions and moral beliefs.

Examining the moral consequences of using fossil fuels/disturbing natural environments.

Expressive Arts (Art and Design, Music, Drama and Dance)

<u>Art and Design</u> – Scottish landscape artists. Examining the development of Scottish landscape paintings. *Are renewable sources of energy an eyesore?*

<u>Music</u> – A Century of Music: An examination of a range of musical styles from the last 100 years. Pupils to pick out key musical features and instrumentation and discuss preferences.

<u>Drama</u> – What do you stand for? Creation and performance of scripted scenes where the impacts of non-renewable energies are discussed and debated between characters with different points of view.

<u>Dance</u> – A Century of Dance; an examination of a range of dance styles from the last 100 years. Pupils will pick out and replicate key characteristics.

Further Information
