Show Racism the Red Card



ParentPay – Online Payments Go Live on 21 October

As you know we are now live with ParentPay in our school. You will have been issued with a letter to show you how to activate your account to enable you to pay for all school related items. Hopefully, you have already done so. However, if you have not already activated your ParentPay account, please do so as soon as possible.

From Thursday 21 October 2021 all meals (breakfasts and lunches) must be paid via ParentPay. Our school cannot accept cash from this date.

If you have any queries or concerns about this or activating your ParentPay account, please contact the school office. They can also advise on how and where to top-up your account using PayPoint, if you are unable to do this online.

Functionality of Online ParentPay System
Parents and Carers – to have the ability to:
Set up a secure online account for each child.
Pay online for all school-related purchases, including meals and non-meal purchases such as trips, events etc.
Have real time balance information displayed online for each child.
Top up balances online by all major credit and debit cards
Subscribe to receive notifications/alerts by email and by SMS when payments are due.
Pre-order meal choices (from 01/02/22).
Link together sibling accounts into a single account so that, within a single transaction, the parent can pay for all offers for all siblings, including meals and non-meal purchases for children at the same school or at different schools within the authority.
Give parental consent online to their child's participation in a school trip (or other activities) for which parental consent is required
When selecting offers, to view any supplementary information associated with school trips and activities necessary for a child's participation
Upload, edit or delete details of specific medical conditions or medication pertaining to their child/ren.

Driving and Parking Behaviour

You may be aware of our ongoing concerns regarding driver behaviour outside the school which is putting children in danger.

To those drivers who put their own convenience before the safety of children, we urge you to avoid double parking or parking at the corners outside Broomhill Primary. If you cannot find a safe parking space outside the school then please park a short distance away. This will ensure a safe crossing area for pupils, families and local residents, and your child/ren will benefit from the short walk to and from school.

We will continue to work with our Parent Council, police and the local authority to eradicate this risk to pupil safety, but it is only parents and carers who can truly eliminate this danger.

A reminder of the School Car Free Zone - moving vehicles (apart from residents with a permit and key services) are banned from Elmwood Avenue and Elmwood Lane during the hours of 8.30am-9.15am and 2.30pm-3.15pm.
