SCHOOL REMINDERS

Wet Mornings

Please ensure your child wears a rainproof jacket to school for the inevitable rainy days. Our playground does not have much shelter and lots of pupils are coming to school without jackets. If the weather is particularly inclement (e.g. high winds or heavy snow) before the start of the school day, then pupils are called into the dining hall by our staff. Pupils will also require jackets for days when they are having PE sessions on the pitch.



PE sessions

As part of Glasgow City Council's PE Code of Practice, all pupils must not have any jewellery, including piercings and all long hair must be tied back. Some other clubs allow children to participate with tape over earrings but it is clear in the Code of Practice that this is not permitted. We recommend that any piercings are carried out at the start of the summer holidays. Healthy Snacks/Lunch

It is great to see the variety of healthy snacks and lunches which the children are bringing into school. We all know that the food we eat (esp. sugar) can make a big impact on our ability to concentrate throughout the day. We thank you for giving them the best fuel for their bodies.

We also ask that pupils do not bring hard sweets and lollipops to school as these are a choking hazard. A reminder that we are a **NUT FREE** school due to serious allergies, including Nutella and some Kinder products.

Road Safety

The roads around the school can be incredibly congested during school drop offs and pick ups. Please make sure that you are helping us keep the pupils safe by parking away from the school and walking to the gates. We ask all parents to ensure that they are not stopping in the middle of the road to drop off/collect their children.

Elmwood Avenue is part of School Streets programme which means that parents (except residents) are not able to drive on these roads between 8:45-9:15 and 2:45-3:15pm. However please remind children to always check before crossing the road.

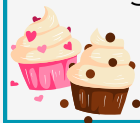


Meet the Teacher
