Cash for Kids: During March, Caldercuilt Primary School took part in the Cash for Kids Schools Challenge which saw pupils, staff and our Parents Council taking part in a range of fundraising activities. Whilst we weren't able to secure one of the cash prizes, we done fantastically to come in 7th out of 21 schools – which included lots of secondary schools – and raise a huge total of £1,387.50!!! Literacy CLOL Update: Term 3 has been a busy one at Caldercuilt! We kicked off the Term with our P1 Bookbug themed Stay and Play. We were delighted to welcome so many parents and our children loved going home with their Bookbug Bags! Our Nursery Class enjoyed weekly Bookbug sessions with their adults too, with lots of singing, rhymes and stories. World Book Day arrived and our Literacy Lions held a Daffodil Tea, inviting families, to join, celebrating reading for pleasure. We had a lovely morning with lots of adults sharing our love of reading. We launched the Description Bubbles in classrooms to help improve our writing! These visuals are across all rooms and provide prompts to build better sentences. A special thank you to the parents who completed our writing survey at Parents Night. We were delighted that all who responded commented that their child was making progress with writing!

As you can see from Term 3, working in partnership with our parents, is so important when raising attainment. We haven't stopped there! This term, look out for our next Literacy Lions Summer Tea event and our Sneaky Peek class clips, letting you see what writing looks like in your child's classroom!

Sunnybrook Station had a busy but focused term. Huge progress was made by all groups. We had lots of meaningful conversations and learning experiences. The 'Core Group' made excellent progress on their targets and moved their targets over to the 'Proud cloud.

They enjoyed some outdoor learning sessions including problem solving games and number work. We welcomed in the parents to make some Easter crafts. This term we are looking forward to getting outside more often for learning and fun. We will also be exploring magnets and making puzzles and mazes using them. The upper groups have been focusing on 'Emotion Works' and 'Friendships'. They also have made significant progress on their targets and have bonded well to work as a team.

The Nursery Class are focusing on signs of spring, baby animals, lifecycles to help them work co-operatively as a group and team. They have been practicing phonological sounds and rhyming words and are beginning to recognise and follow patterns, fractions and one line of symmetry. They continue to develop their understanding routines in terms of time, pattern and days of the week. Outdoor play has taken a focus on estimation, volume, capacity and making predictions. We always encourage positive interactions between adults and peers, with a focus on when to talk and when to listen and engage in purposeful play and conversation relevant to the learning context or situation. We continually look to develop children's higher order thinking Skills (HOTS) which is great preparation for Primary 1.

Transitions for our pre-schoolers are well underway with daily toothbrushing in P1, STEM with P1 on Wednesdays and on Thursdays and Fridays there has been some planned learning tasks which play based up with Primary 1. Our Team Leader and CDO's continue to

work with the children on the Transition pack with supporting video's sent through seesaw. P1 teacher also has a pack. All preschool children have had a pack sent home this week.

Play along Maths sessions are currently starting with our team leader and pre-school families. The Preschool moving on ceremony will take PLACE ON Monday 19th June and parents will receive an invitation from the nursery shortly.

Primary 1 had a wonderful term 3, we learned lots about space and had some very interesting visitors in the classroom to support our learning. We've practised our sounds and everyone is growing in confidence with their spelling and sounding out.

This term we will be learning about people who help us. The children are very excited to have a fire station in the classroom! In PE we are practising some athletics and fitness, we're hoping the good weather will mean we will be outdoors for our PE sessions. Our learning in maths and numeracy will be subtraction, multiplication and division, and more practise of telling the time and using money. We're moving to writing longer sentences, using connectives to extend our thinking. We are also learning to write descriptions linked to our topic and using lots of adjectives in our sentences.

Primary 2 had a brilliant time in term 3 enjoying lots of exciting learning including work with our coach Harry, learning to write instructions, lots of visitors for STEM week and some fabulous Friday quizzes. This term we look forward to working with our new dance coach Daniella, exploring our new topic based around animals and lots more French starting with fruits and vegetables. In literacy we will be looking to write some informative reports linked to our topic as well as begin a class novel. In maths we will look more at fractions, the 4 processes and money. Mr McCusker will be teaching time and also start our RSHP learning in HWB. PE remains on a Wednesday. Children should come in suitable clothing to take part and remove jewellery. As the weather starts to heat up we hope to get outside a little more for PE, use of the trim trail and outdoor learning although please make sure children still come equipped with a jacket for this. Any questions please do not hesitate to contact me on seesaw, Miss McMullen.

Primary 3 worked hard last term to research and present their country projects. I would like to thank everyone that came along to our walkthrough, I know the class really enjoyed sharing their learning and receiving feedback from you all! This term the class have decided they would like to learn about the Egyptians as their topic. We will be learning about procedural writing in Literacy this term and fractions and time for Numeracy. For PE we are expanding our ball skills and learning some Tennis.

Primary 4 worked hard in term 3 and really enjoyed learning about Scotland. This term our interdisciplinary learning (IDL) topic is 'Nature' and we will be focusing on procedural writing linked to this. Our iPad's will be used to research about Nature and to present our findings. We are exploring friendships and working with a partner to complete a writing project, which we hope to share in a celebration afternoon. We have Health week this term which will focus on keeping our minds and bodies healthy. Sports Day is this term also and we are developing our athletics skills in preparation for this. We will focus on fractions, measure, time intervals and place value this term as well as continue to revise the four operations $(+ - x \div)$ and estimate an answer to a calculation or problem. Finally, we will be able to work in our House Groups and working parties with children in all other classes.

Primary 5 are excited to be learning about different sports this term. We are lucky enough to have a coach work with us on athletics and games starting on Tuesday 16th May for 6 weeks. In literacy our class novel this term will be James and the Giant Peach and we will be working on writing procedural texts and reading non-fiction books about sports personalities and sports grounds/events. We will complete personal projects and present a 1- 2 minute talk. In maths we will focus on our number work as well as decimals, time, angles, co-ordinates and data handling. We hope to participate in more outdoor learning as the term progresses. In Health and Well-being we will complete lessons on Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood and continue developing our knowledge of understanding of dealing with our emotions. We are showing more responsibility in school and are getting ready to move to P6.

Primary 6 are in their last term of school before they become Primary 7's and they are super excited! This term we will be meeting our Primary 1 buddies and will be getting trained to play games with them and support them. We have also written some fantastic letters to welcome them to our school too. We are learning a lot this term and a few examples are: Relationships Sexual Health and Parenting, procedural writing, measure and time in maths and our we will focus on Sports for our Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL) topic as well as weekly science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) activities.

Primary 7...And in the blink of an eye it's the final term with our wonderful Primary 7s. This term we continue to have high expectations our of learners, as they embark on transition visits, sporting opportunities and our Leavers Assembly. In Literacy the children are focussing on instructional writing, continuing with inferencing tasks in reading and widening their vocabulary with Word Aware strategies for key vocabulary linked to our Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL) topic. So far, we have welcomed in several professionals from different sectors of the workforce to share their own experiences and advice about the World of Work. In the weeks that follow we will welcome even more visitors in and think about higher education and their options after Secondary School. In Numeracy and Maths, we are revising all the areas we have covered this year, to ensure that all learners are feeling confident and fabulous for starting Secondary School.

Other information:

P6 Blairvadach Trip August 2023: We are very excited that our current P5 class will be going on a residential trip to Blairvadach in August 2023! The new P6 class will be able to enjoy all of the fun and adventure that comes with staying overnight away from home and taking part in a wide range of outdoor education activities. An information session has taken place, parents have begun fundraising and the school will contact families before the end of term regarding payments.

Children's working parties have been working well with every child in the school being part of one of seven groups who have a focus on school improvement. These parties meet monthly and your child will be able to tell you about the exciting things they are doing.

School Houses: Our P7 school captains and vice captains have been meeting with their teams monthly and have made us all so proud with their confidence and inspiring and creative inputs.

Children's forum is part of Glasgow City Councils methodology for gathering the views of our young people. Sophie and Cole continue to represent Caldercuilt at the City Chambers feedback at assembly to all our pupils.

ParentsPortal: If you haven't already done so, please sign up to ParentsPortal. This is a Glasgow-wide school application accessed via your MyGov account. At the start of term, instead of giving home Annual Data checks (which entails a great volume of paperwork) Glasgow City Council opted for the ParentsPortal system which has been previously used by other authorities with great success. It is imperative to sign-up to ParentsPortal to check and/or inform the school of any changes regarding contact and medical details. For security purposes, ParentsPortal relies on parents and carers signing up to match the exact contact details that we currently have on our system Once you have activated your account, you will be prompted to check your child's emergency details are up-to-date. If you are having any trouble signing up to ParentsPortal, please contact the school office.
