If you can think of other ways of keeping you informed with regards to your child's progress please let us know.

- 1. Regular newsletters which you collect at the nursery keep you informed of forthcoming events
- 2. Our Notice/Info boards located outside at the initial entrance door, in the entrance hall and foyer has up to date news of local community events and also nursery highlights
- 3. A progress record of your child's development is kept by his/her Keyworker which can be seen at any time
- 4. You will see in the foyer our School Improvement Plan. This informs you of the improvements highlighted for the year. Our newsletter keeps you up to date of the many learning opportunities your child will have. Photographs are taken to show the child engaged in learning.
- 5. Photographs are displayed around the nursery and in learning journals showing the learning taking place in the nursery during each term.
- 6. Each child compiles a profile over his/her two years at nursery which is theirs to take home. Parents can access these at any time. They can be found in the quiet room outside the family room door. Please feel free to contribute any pictures etc. done at home.

- 7. Parents are welcome to speak to any member of staff either informally or by prior arrangement. These meetings can be confidential and a private room can be provided. Formal parents meetings to discuss progress are organised twice a year.
- 8. There are opportunities to get involved in all aspects of nursery activities such as outings, story telling etc. or by joining our Parents Group who do a marvellous job of fundraising, ECO and influencing policy.
- 9. In the Summer term the parents of pre-school children receive a written report which is forwarded to school. This reflects their progress and readiness for school. Parents of pre-school children receive a written report on progress to date.
