Adjective = an **adjective** describes a noun (The noisy classroom.)

Noun = a noun is the name of a thing, such as an **object**, a **place** or a **person** (table, school, teacher)

Verb = a verb is **doing** word. It is a word in a sentence that shows action. (The boy played in the park.)

Proper noun = a proper noun is the **name** of a particular person, place or thing. They always have a capital letter. (Mrs Smith, Glasgow, Stirling Castle)

Punctuation = punctuation makes a sentence makes sense. For example **capital letter**, **full stop**, **question mark** and **comma**

(John likes apples, bananas and grapes. What do you like?)

Rhyming word = words that rhyme have **similar sounds**. (cat and bat, good and food)
