Child Protection: Absence From School

If your child is not able to attend school for any reason, you must alert the absence line before 9am. Failure to alert staff or the absence line that your child cannot attend causes concern for us under our child protection procedures.

We must be satisfied that every child is accounted for on every school day. Unfortunately we have some families who do not alert us to absence and do not respond to our calls and texts. Please help us avoid unnecessary worry by calling the absence line.

Please record your child's absence online or phone the dedicated absence team on: <u>0141 287 0039</u> from 8am on the first day of absence <u>AND</u> every subsequent day. It is important that the school is kept up to date during any long term absences. We appreciate that often the absence line is very busy, if you have a difficulty getting through to the absence line then call our office and we can record the call from there.



Parents are strongly encouraged not to take their children out of school for family holidays. Should you wish to remove your child from school for any reason you <u>must</u> put your request in writing to the Head Teacher.

Home Learning



Our first Home Learning (Homework) cycle of 2023 begins on Monday 15th January. Home Learning activities issued on this date should be completed by the time specified by the class teacher.

Home Learning issued will be direct reinforcement of classwork in spelling and numeracy along with a reading focus. Classes may have additional activities linked to their topic work.

Home Learning activities will be posted on Seesaw or in a jotter provided by the class teacher. Tasks should be completed and submitted for marking. If you child requires a new Home Learning Jotter, please ask them to speak to their class teacher.
