SeeSaw is an online platform

to allow the class teacher to share examples of your child's learning with you. This is a simple platform designed to be easy to use for younger children. You can use this platform to message the teacher directly, but this should only be questions regarding your child's learning. Showbie is the online platform that is used in P5—P7, across most Glasgow schools. This platform is little bit more sophisticated that SeeSaw and the children can use Showbie for digital learning tasks in class and at home. Our P6s and P7s all now have their own iPad and many choose to use this platform to share examples of their best work with the teacher and their parents and carers.

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P1 August 2024



If you wish to enrol your child for the start of the new school session in August 2024, they must have attained the age of 5 years between 1 March 2024 and the 28 February 2025.

Parents/carers of those children due to commence attendance at school in August 2024 should now register their children for the appropriate local primary school during the week commencing Monday 6 to Friday 10 November 2023. To register you should now complete an online application and submit no later than Friday 10 November 2023.
