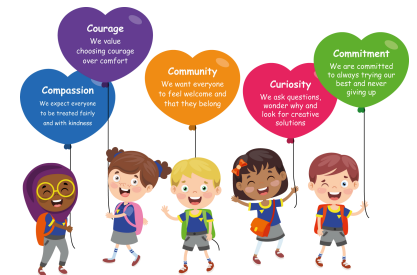

Firstly, I would like to thank our Family Partnership and parent volunteers for helping to make our Winter Fair a great success. We raised almost £1200 and it was great to see so many members of the local community come along to support this event.

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PROMOTING POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR

At the start of each term, we focus on revising our school rules and what these mean to us. We discuss what it means to be **READY, RESPONSIBLE AND SAFE**. Classes have been busy discussing which of our values and rules they would like to focus on this term, to be "Good Croftfoot Citizens".

Children are awarded a class star when displaying our school values and modelling being Ready, Responsible and Safe. The stars are counted each week and the class with the most stars receives an additional playtime. If a class receives "Class of The Week", three times with a term, they can choose a special reward for their class.

We also celebrate individual success through with "Pupil of the Week" certificates. Mrs Leitch (HT) also sends home HT postcards to children who have gone above and beyond what is expected of them.

RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOL

Our Rights Respecting School Steering group have been working extremely hard with Mr McDonagh to raise awareness of the UNCRC.

This term we will be exploring the issue of Equity Vs Equality. We will be exploring what this means to us at Croftfoot and how we can ensure that everyone feels that they are treated fairly

We will be supporting the children in understanding that there may be times we need different things to help everyone to feel safe and included.

ROAD SAFETY!

Last term, we had a significant number of incidents at drop off and pick up times. As a result, we are working in partnership with our local community Police officer, JRSO co-ordinator Lorna Young and the Road Traffic Enforcement Team. Over the next few months there will :

- Spot checks from Transport Police to issue fines to parents/carers who continue to park on the zig zag lines.
- Warnings issued to parents/carers who double park and place their children/other children at risk of harm.
- Community Campaigns / Parking Pledge Campaign

- Regular review of this issue with the Chair of our Family Partnership

PUPIL EQUITY FUND (PEF)

PEF is allocated directly to schools and targeted at closing the poverty related attainment gap. Every council area is benefitting from PEF and 97% of schools in Scotland have been allocated funding for pupils in P1-S3 known to be eligible for free school meals.

Since 2021, our allocated PEF amount has decreased due to the number of parents/carers not applying for free school meal entitlement for children in P1-P5.

This is partly due to meals now being free in P1 - P5 and many parents waiting to P6 until they apply for this entitlement.

As a result of this, we are now receiving £12,000 less PEF. Last session, we also lost our additional staffing entitlement which resulted in a reduction in our teaching allocation.
