Resources		Comments
Area Characteristics		
Age-appropriate container for sand/water		
Sand resources clearly displayed to allow		
children to appropriately select		
Age-appropriate container for sand/water		
Opportunities for children to mix water and		
sand		
Clearly organised to avoid clutter		
Clearly labelled open access storage to		
encourage independence		
Designated space for shoes if sand is on the		
floor		
Constant Provision (to be checked daily)		
Towel, mop (water)		
Dustpan and brush (sand)		
Aprons		
Variety of different sized containers e.g. test		
tubes, different sized bottles, jugs		
Funnels and tubing of various sizes		
Variety of spoons/scoops in different materials		
e.g. wooden, metal, tablespoon, teaspoon, long		
handled, scoops, ladles		
Variety of pouring containers e.g. watering can,		
water wheels, siphon, containers with		
holes/sieves		
Sand holding containers of different sizes and		
materials e.g. metal, plastic, wooden buckets,		
moulds		
Possible enhancements:	-	
Pattern making resources e.g. rakes		
Jewels, coins, loose parts .		
Bottles with stoppers/screw lids		
Natural resources e.g. stones, shells, sticks,		
flowers,		

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Small world resources linked to children's interests e.g. coins, jewels, people, boats, animals, dinosaurs, trucks	
Water channeling resources e.g. pipes, gutters, water wheels	
Whisks	
Sensory enhancements e.g. food colouring, herbs and spices, flowers etc	
Sponges	
Stones with letters/numbers on them	
Example of Materials other than sand:	
Variety of sand e.g. different grades and colours	
Variety of base materials e.g. soil, porridge, lentils, rice
