Area characteristics		
Clearly labeled open access storage		
Can be a refined area or embedded throughout setting		
Jigsaws and board games to be supported by adults		
Constant Provision (to be checked daily)		
Numbers e.g. wooden, magnetic, labels		
Number lines (wall and floor) - complete and incomplete		
Loose parts for counting, sorting, pattern, symmetry (bottle tops, curtain rings, corks, shells, twigs, stones, gems, beads, cubes etc)		
Ten-frames		
Dice		
Sand timers/stop watches		
Clocks at children's height		
Measuring equipment e.g. measuring tapes, scales, rulers		
Height chart		
Calculator		
Clipboards, paper, pens/pencils		
2D and 3D shapes (regular and irregular)

Games - dominoes, cards, shapes, matching, counting, jigsaws (supported by adults)
