



The 12 hours of CPL question

Scottish Government have updated the Funding follows the child and The National Standard for Early Learning and Childcare providers: Operating Guidance in line with our new CPL requirements.

Sub-criteria 1.4 now reads: All SSSC registered staff in the setting are achieving the Continuous Professional Learning requirements as set by the SSSC.



The ELC workforce should follow the new requirements for CPL by covering the seven core learning elements each year, including mandatory learning for trauma awareness and child and adult protection.



Annual declaration and sampling

- Each year an annual declaration will be signed to say that the registrant has completed CPL on their registration anniversary.
- If they have not completed CPL, or are sampled, we will ask for further information and contact their supervisor or counter-signatory for the organisation for confirmation.
- Sampling questions from June 2025 will concentrate on Trauma informed practice and Child and Adult protection. We will also ask what registrants have done to cover the core learning elements.





Summary

- All core learning elements must be covered every year. It is up to the registrant and their supervisor to select appropriate learning.
- Trauma learning and Adult and Child protection are mandatory every year. These can be informal opportunities as well as formal sessions.
- We provide suggestions via our CPL website to free training and resources relevant to the core learning elements.
- The Learning Zone and CPL Portal for ELC are searchable.
- Employers can provide their own learning opportunities or direct registrants to those on the CPL website and registrants are free to record their CPL as they choose.
