

Hear: When Armstrong told his friends about his idea, they thought he was being silly and dangerous.

Say: Do you think Armstrong was being silly and dangerous? Why? Why not? What advice would you have given him?

Play: Can you find any items that you would pack for your trip to the moon if you were Armstrong? Can you use different materials to make the items?

Write: Draw pictures of the items you would pack in your suitcase if you were going to the moon with Armstrong. Have a go at writing some of the names of the items on the labels.



Hear: Armstrong finds the moon very lonely and boring.

Say: Have you ever felt lonely? What did you do? Who helps to cheer you up when you're feeling sad or upset?

Play: Can you do something for someone to make them smile? It might be painting them a picture or a drawing. It could be telling them a joke or giving them a big smile!

Write: As Armstrong arrives home, all of his friends are waiting for him. What do you think they are thinking as they see him? Write down what you think they might be thinking.
