PROGRAMME DESCRIPTOR: Families Connect

The Families Connect programme provides a series of activities, techniques and games that parents and carers can practice with their children in order to consider how they can introduce these into their own home environments. The programme recognises the role parents play in the education of their children and the value of creating a home environment that is conducive to learning.

Curricular Area - Literacy, Numeracy, Health & Wellbeing

It focuses on three key areas of development: Social and emotional development (week 1, 2 & 3) Literacy and language development (week 4 & 5) Numeracy and mathematics (week 6 & 7)

Families Connect uses play as the vehicle for learning and interaction with parents and between parents and their children.

Target Audience

- Early Years
- Early Primary
 - *Parents/Carers of children aged 4-6 years

Resources:

- Training Families Connect facilitator training is a two day course requiring two staff from each setting to attend, delegates can include; Teacher, Lead Practitioners of Attainment, Child Development Officer, Family Support Worker, Support for Learning staff etc.
- Staff Two facilitators are required to deliver the programme at all times
- Time The programme is delivered over 8 weeks; 8 x 2 hours workshops
- Material –Training manual (supplied by Save the Children)
 Resource box (supplied by Save the Children)
- Budget Small budget for a light family meal/snack e.g. sandwiches, soup, fruit etc. and small items of stationery/equipment. Approx. £150
- Venue This programme can be delivered in any setting e.g. nursery, school, community facility etc. as long as a quiet room/space is available within the venue that accommodates a maximum of 12 parents/carers and 12 children participating in the workshops.

Planned Outcomes:

Intended outcomes for children:

- Improvements in child's softer skills in regards to education and motivation to learn
- Improvements in child's social and emotional skills
- Improvements in child's communication skills
- Improvements in child's interest in and understanding of literacy and numeracy

Intended outcomes for parents:

- Improvements in parent/child communication
- Increase in understanding and empathy for their child's learning
- Increase in parental motivation to support their child's learning
- Increase in parent's confidence in supporting their child's learning
- Increase in communication between parents and school

Intended outcomes for schools:

- · Increase in parental engagement in the school
- Strengthening of relationships between the school and parents

Aims & Objectives:



- Providing activities that parents/carers and children can do together to stimulate the home learning environment
- Provide parents with information, strategies and techniques that improve their knowledge of how they can support their child's learning
- Model how to how to approach, engage and work with families (parental engagement)
- Create opportunities for schools and parents to build relationships

Method:

Families Connect is designed for parents and carers with
at least one child who is aged between four to six years old. Families
attend a series of two-hour workshops delivered in school/nursery over eight weeks
with timings of the workshops arranged to suit parents' needs.
 Parents attend some elements of the workshop by themselves and some with their
children. Workshop themes are;

Week 1: Focus on Feelings

Week 2: The Importance of Praise

Week 3: The Importance of Listening

Week 4: Book Talk

Week 5: Beyond the Page

Week 6: The Importance of Counting

Week 7: Number Talk

Week 8: Celebration and Evaluation

Monitoring and Evaluation

Save the Children have incorporated a robust monitoring, evaluation and quality
assurance process within the Families Connect programme. This process is covered
in the 2 day training and a toolkit of all relevant documentation is provided.

Adaptations:

A compressed six week programme of Families Connect is available to suit online
delivery of the programme, retaining an emphasis on social and emotional
development and wellbeing alongside literacy in the context of the COVID -19 crisis
and recovery. The six weeks programme covers;

Week 1: Welcome and Play

Week 2: Feelings

Week 3: Praise and listening Week 4: Book Talk and Storytelling

Week 5: Counting

Week 6: Number Talk
