Aims of the Session

- Highlight the importance of a family centred/ family learning approach that supports meaningful transition into Primary 1
- Discuss why a family learning approach supports enhanced transition whilst in the early months of primary 1
- Provide additional resources to support primary 1 children and their families with an evidence based family learning programme using The Everywhere Bear book from our 'Families in Partnership-Starting School Transition Programme'





Why is Family Learning Important?

- Parents are a child's first educator, what goes on at home can fundamentally shape a child's first views of the world and approaches to learning.
- Children spend more time out of school/ nursery than in – 85% in home/community
- Working in partnership with parents EARLY on starts with realising how important they are to children's learning (early intervention)
- The Families in Partnership- Starting School
 Programme supports transition to primary one and all children in Glasgow will have had access to this via their Early Year Establishment.





Why are Family Transitions Important?

- The key messages through evidence and research:
 - A holistic approach recognises that the whole family are going through change, not just the child, and that it's a **process**, not a series of individual events.
 - If parents expect transitions to be positive, then children are more likely to feel relaxed and happy too.
 - Provides opportunity to develop and deepen relationships with the whole family
 - Provides opportunity for parents to 'build their social capital' and support one another (make pals lol!)
 - Parental participation in children's education influences child's outcomes positively.

The story so far...?


- When children come to Primary One in August 2023 they will have been offered/ taken part in the Families in Partnership- Starting School Family Learning Programme with their feeder nursery
- Family Transition learning resources to support pre school transition
- Activity pack four weeks worth of family learning resources with a literacy/numeracy and health and wellbeing focus
- Last year 6811 packs were distributed across ALL Early Years, Childminders, and via Primary Schools who enrolled families who didn't attend nursery e.g. in Govanhill
- They will have received the book "The Everywhere Bear"
- This training today will provide additional family learning activities as an extension into Primary 1








Useful Information

Session Set Up

Parents/carers are invited to the session 30

staff and other parents.

- The staff outline the session to the parents/carers and explain in an informal way-sitting down with parents is always good
- Explain the importance of them being there for their child and how its building upon the programme they did at nursery and settle into P1
- Based on fun activities that families can do together using the Everywhere Bear Book.



























Impact Statements 2022

"I liked reading with my granny. I liked making my Everywhere Bear called "Sophie" (child)


