OU-SCILT course: Teachers Learning to Teach languages (TeLT)

TeLT is an innovative, blended professional learning programme offered by the Open University in partnership with SCILT. Teachers simultaneously learn a new language and the skills to teach that language in the classroom. The languages strand is offered in four languages – French, German, Mandarin and Spanish – and at two levels – beginners and post-beginners. The pedagogy strand covers a diverse range of pedagogical approaches.

TeLT is open to all teachers who teach, or aspire to teach, languages in primary schools. The programme carries Professional Recognition from GTCS and Masters credits from the OU. There is a cost for the programme and typically local authorities sponsor their teachers.

Scotland's Languages Leadership Programme (SLLP)

Scotland's Languages Leadership Programme is run in partnership by SCILT and Education Scotland, with support from local authority partners.

SLLP is open to teachers with five years postprobation experience (or similar) working in primary, secondary or special education settings in Scotland. It is aligned to the GTCS Professional Standards for CLPL and Middle Leaders and carries GTCS Professional Recognition: leadership in languages education.
