
Incorporating the COP26 as a teaching opportunity

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We all took part in the Votes for Schools to say that we thought Climate Change affected Children's Rights around the World. Children were worried about pets and fireworks.

They then wrote to their MSP, MP, local authority and local firework display organisers.

> We were worried about the damage in mining for the explosives.



We thought it was a bad idea to use planes and ships to transport them. There are lots of bits of plastic that get left behind that go in the sea and can kill animals. They shared their concerns about child labour, pet safety and the environmental impact of displays.

PARTITION EDUCATION SCOTLAND PROJECT

We are in the process of developing Scotland's first teaching and learning resource pack about the partition of British India in 1947, in time for the 75th anniversary of independence in 2022.

Why do we need this resource?

- 7% of the UK population identifies as British Asian
 - 5% identify as being from South Asian countries (2011)
- The British Empire ruled over the sub-continent for nearly 200 years.
- Rule ended in 1947...only 74 years ago
- Partition resulted in around 2 million deaths
