The children appreciated the value of communication and trusting each other to help them get out of the dark room. Miss Hayworth has already posted some pictures on the school website and P7 were keen to share their thoughts too.

"It was a really good visit. We got a tour of the fire truck and we did a room of risks where we had to try and point them out. We went into a dark room and shuffled around trying to find a casualty. We all managed it but some of us bumped our heads trying to climb through a hole. We met a few fire fighters and they told us stories about cats up a tree and the most common situations that start a fire. We got to see some pictures of bad accidents where the fire brigade had to go and help.

We learned what to do in a fire situation – get out the building and phone 999. We learned the motto – get out, stay out, call us out. We learned how to stay safe in a fire:

- if you can't get out go into a room, close the door
- put blankets and socks/pillows under the door so the fire can't get out.
- you then need to open the window to get fresh air and scream to get help.
- You then stay on the ground because the smoke rises. "

Successful bid from East Area Partnership

Thanks to the six children – Emma, Grace, Lia, Temi, Yoana and Satin who confidently represented the school and appealed to the community for money for the school. We were delighted to be awarded **£2407** for the project and this money has been used to buy cooking kitchens for the school. Thanks to the children and the families who supported this.

Great news – the Parent Council also asked the Area Partnership for money and was successful in being awarded £2000 to source the pots, pans and cooking utensils. This is wonderful news! We can look forward to healthy food being prepared by the children and families in school. We want to pass on a huge thank you from the school for the work of the Parent Council.

Pupil Equity Fund

This money is specifically to raise attainment in literacy, numeracy and health and wellbeing and strict guidance has been provided to help Head Teachers and schools to develop plans for this.
