School improvement

Guidance on school improvement suggests that schools select no more than three priorities each year. These should reflect school, Glasgow and national priorities and takes into account the 'Thoughts please...' exercise carried out in May. As a result, the areas we will focus on next session include:

- 1. Glasgow's Improvement Challenge this is linked to the Attainment Challenge and builds on the work started this year.
- 2. Our curriculum this will give us a chance to explore what makes Golfhill unique and to develop a rationale and model that really reflects us as a school community.
- 3. Meeting learners' needs this builds on the inclusion work carried out this session.

I am in the process of developing the school improvement plan and will be happy to share more information after the summer.
