Foyer

Security/entering the school

As a school we continually review procedures and this month, our focus is on security and health and safety. To help keep our children safe we will be locking both the car park gate and the Onslow Drive gate during break and lunchtime.

With the re-design of the foyer, we kindly ask that all parents/carers and visitors to the school first use the foyer window to speak to clerical staff. We are keen to extend the use of the area outside P1 and P2/1 for learning and teaching rather than as a waiting area. This means that any adult visitor/parent/carer will, having signed in, be asked to take a seat in the foyer. Your help with this is greatly appreciated. Thank you.

Information was collated and displayed as a graph. Staff discussed the results and a focus group of children and the Parent Council are doing the same on **Friday 20 May**.
