

Dear Parent/Carer,

## P1 enrolment

It is that time of year again when we start to register new children for Primary 1. This will take place across Glasgow schools in the week of 7-11 November. If you have children due to start school or if you know children who are due to start, please share these details with them.

Members of the School Leadership Team (Principal Teachers/Head Teacher) will be available at the following times to enrol children for school:

Monday 7 November and Tuesday 8 November 9 – 10 a.m.

Wednesday 9 November and Friday 11 November 9 - 10 a.m. and 2 - 3 p.m.

Should these times not suit, please telephone the school office for an alternative.

It is important that children enrol at the catchment school. Should parents/carers wish to send their child to a school other than the catchment school, please ask at the catchment school for a placing request form. 

**Two consultations** – lots of opportunity to make your voice heard

#### **GPCF**

The National Parent Forum for Scotland would like to talk to you on a range of different topics. They are hosting a focus group at the school on 17 November. No preparation is required, they just want to know gut feelings and impressions. It is totally casual with no right or wrong answers.

The focus group will run for about 90 minutes from 1:30 pm with refreshments on offer for those involved. The NPFS will also make a small donation school funds. This is the same evening as parents night and the focus group will take place prior to parents evening kicking off at 3pm.

#### **SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT**

On 3 October Ashley attended a meeting of Glasgow's Parent Council Forum to represent Golfhill Primary School and learn more about the **Scottish Government's Education Review**. The Scottish Government has begun a national consultation into how our schools are run. They are looking feedback about how things are working and what could be better. In their words:

Who should take decisions in relation to the education of children and young people and how the funding of education can be made fairer. We know that teachers and practitioners need support to do their jobs and that they need opportunities for high quality professional development. The governance review seeks your views on how this can be improved.

The Scottish Government have kicked off a national consultation about this review. They want the views of parents, teachers and all communities . There are 17 questions the government are asking in the review. These are open questions ranging from looking at governance generally, to value for money, to accountability. There is a lot in the consultation document so I would encourage you to have a look for yourself!

If you would like to feed into the consultation, there will be an in-person event in Glasgow where you can share your views with the government on **10th November**. One session from 10-1 and a second session from 6pm – 8pm. Register using this link.
