# Pupil Equity Fund

Along with most schools across Scotland, we have received another allocation of funding from the Scottish Government to help support pupil attainment.

Increased costs across different services have forced us to make some difficult decisions, one of which is not renewing our relationship with Barnardo's. We are fortunate that all staff have now received training in *Promoting Alternative Thinking Skills* (PATHS) which is our emotional literacy programme, so this will still be taught. However, we know that the *Stay and Play* sessions have been popular so we will explore other ways to facilitate these.

Much of our allocation is devoted to human resources (staffing), but we have kept some money aside to purchase resources and materials which will enhance the learning experiences of pupils across the school.

### Message from Cordia



In line with stricter Scottish Government legislation designed to reduce sugar, salt and fat intake, Cordia (who run the dinner school) have announced that from August, they will no longer be selling cookies at lunchtime. *No more 50ps required*!

Our Parent Council needs new members! The current board will be stepping down soon, and there are exciting opportunities for anyone interested in getting involved.


