


## Staffing update

## Other COVID-related information

Although we can return to having one school day for every class, the most recent Scottish Government advice does keep certain measures in place, including:



- Adults maintaining physical distance and wearing face coverings at drop-off / pick-up
- Only one adult per family in playground at drop-off / pick-up
- Staying off school grounds if possible, by dropping older pupils at the gate
- Hand cleaning
- Staff wearing face coverings in communal areas / when moving through building
- Physical distancing between members of staff
- Physical distancing between staff and pupils
- Enhanced cleaning regime
- Increased ventilation, with doors and windows open
- CO<sub>2</sub> monitoring
- Not coming to school if anyone in household is displaying COVID-19 symptoms

Unfortunately, the guidance also means it will not be possible to return to face-to-face Parents' Evenings just yet.

Telephone consultations will take place again, in the weeks leading up to Spring Break.

We have consulted with the Parent Council, and listened to the feedback from last time. Appointment times will be provided, and up to three weeks' notice of your allocated time will be given.

P7/6	Wed 30 <sup>th</sup> and Thu 31 <sup>st</sup> March



NB: Families who require interpreters may find their dates do not align exactly with this.

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Last week we were visited by two inspectors from Education Scotland. This was a follow-up from our inspection back in November 2019.

### Celebrating success


