Thank you to everyone who voted in our Homework Referendum which was held at Parents' Evening last month.



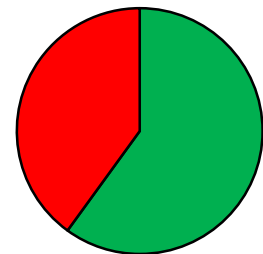
Thanks also to our P6 and P7 classes who designed posters and created videos outlining the arguments *for* and *against* homework. They did a great job, and presented some very compelling cases.
