Nurture

Between January and June, we introduced the six Nurture Principles to our pupils (one a month during assembly).

Pupils were then set a challenge to produce versions specifically for Golfhill, using child-friendly language. The work that went into this was phenomenal, with children having incredibly rich discussions in their classes.

It was all co-ordinated by our wonderful DHT, Miss Kirkland, who then set one final challenge: to design a poster to display our Nurture Principles.

The final version took inspiration from the work produced by three P6 pupils (ER, JK and SJ), and will be displayed around the school...

Attendance

We continue to monitor attendance figures, and where necessary, contact families to highlight any concerns.



Our current average attendance across the whole school is: 91%

Broken down by class, the average attendances are:

P1: 92% P2: 89% P3: 90% P4: 92%

P5: 93% **P6**: 92% **P7**: 91%

The national average is 95% - 97% attendance, which equates to about 8 full days off a year. Anything less than that, especially below 85%, can become worrying.

If you struggle to get your child to school, speak to us so we can work together to see what supports or strategies might be available.



That said, we do ask you to exercise common sense. If your child is ill, they should not some to school. They will just be sent home, and could infect others in the meantime, including members of staff.



Please also note that when someone has been sick or had diarrhoea, NHS advice is clear that they must not return to school for **at least 48 hours** after the last occurrence.



Finally, while we are obliged to discourage it, we are sympathetic to families who take holidays during term-time. We know that the cost differences can be substantial. However, if you do make this choice, please note that no school work will be provided.

Groupcall / Xpressions

We continue to encourage all families to download the **free** *Groupcall Xpressions* app, which is available on all smartphones.



The app gives families an easy way to get updates and information from the school, and all you need to use it is the email address you have registered with us. Another great feature is that you can actually message us!

It doesn't cost us anything to send messages to the app, but when they are delivered via text, it can cost around £3.60 to message the whole school.



That might not seem a lot, but it all adds up, and with budgets stretched as much as they are, every penny saved makes a difference!
