
Message from Head Teacher

You will recall we refreshed our school values at the end of last year. From families to staff to pupils, everyone had their say, and the final tally revealed our new values as:

Vandalism

Now for something less positive...



In recent weeks we have been plagued by a spate of vandalism in our pupil toilets. This includes the boys **and** girls facilities, and in the upstairs **and** downstairs toilets.

The vandalism has included:

- Deliberate blocking of sinks with tissues, and taps left running
- Delibrate blocking of urinals, so when the automatic flush kicks in, they flood over
- Water then flooding through to the rooms below
- Stuffing of tissues down the toilet pans
- Graffiti, including offensive language and symbols

We will never prevent any pupil from using a bathroom. It is a human right. However, there are times when *some* of the facilities simply cannot be used because of what has happened.

The time and cost implications of managing these events is huge, and it cannot continue.

We have discussed the issue at length at our two most recent assemblies, but we would ask that you reinforce the message at home: no school property should be deliberately damaged or destroyed.

Attendance



We have been monitoring attendance rates, in line with established procedures, and to co-ordinate with Glasgow City Council's *Attendance Matters Every Day* campaign.

Looking at the same period from last year, average attendance across the school has improved by over 1.5%. This is good news.

However, when looking at this school year specifically, we have seen a drop in the figures before and after November, which is less good. We will continue to keep an eye on this.
