The results of the survey conducted last session about spending PEF money on the Baby Strings programme showed that 93% of the 80 returns were in favour of



this. As a result, we are going to start the programme, looking to be fully operational by the end of term 2.

In the next few weeks, the school will be purchasing additional stringed instruments to enable children to access in-school music tuition via the Baby Strings programme.

In addition, if you have a violin/viola or cello that you would like to donate to the school at this time, this would be very much appreciated. Please ensure any instruments donated are not in need of major repair beyond needing tuned/restrung.


Showbie
