<p style="text-align: center;">4 – Fundraising for school playground equipment</p> <p>Jolene has very kindly done some research into available sources of funding. Most require a specific project and therefore a discussion was had on options. Top priority is new basketball equipment, and possibly recycling bins.</p>	<p>Mr Gemmill agreed to find out what was needed to fit this from the facilities manager of the school, and liaise with Jolene. Jolene will investigate options for applying for funding for general playground equipment.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">5 – Impact of teacher’s pay dispute</p> <p>Raised by Chiara. From Karen: the proposed pay rise from John Swinney in Jan this year was rejected by the EIS council. The offer is now with EIS Union members to vote to accept or reject the deal. If accepted, there will be no further action. If the deal is rejected, there could then be a ballot for industrial action. Timescales for this remain unclear, likely to take a few months. The impact of industrial action was discussed and what contingency plans could be made, but the discussions are at an early and uncertain phase and therefore much is unknown.</p>	<p>Karen will keep the PC informed of developments.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">6 – AOB</p> <p>a. Groupcall app – a question was asked via Facebook as to whether the school would consider using ShowMyHomework App as this is more intuitive to use? Groupcall has been initiated Glasgow wide by the whole council authority and deals with different tasks to ShowMyHomework. There have been some teething problems, and staff shortages have meant a delay in reviewing the use of Groupcall within HHS. There was also a general discussion of the pros (increased digital awareness, access to different technologies) and cons (increased screen time, loss of writing and communication skills, poor ergonomics) of tablets being introduced within HHS in 2021. Key issues are what the tables will be used</p>	<p>Karen agreed to ask various other schools who have had Groupcall for longer how they resolved teething problems.</p>

Notre Dame High school consultation re going co-ed – the papers will be ready by the end of January and go to committee meeting in February for approval. If approved, the consultation can then start. This could have a big impact on the demographic of HHS.</p> <p>c. Bridge the Gap project had asked if parents would be interested in a series of family activities and workshops, offered for free. Discussion about likely uptake of this, and the possibility of linking a workshop to a pre-existing activity ie the Christmas Fayre.</p>	<p>As/when the consultation goes ahead, the link will be shared via HHS with parents for their consideration.</p> <p>Post-meeting note: Sylvia has been in touch with Notre Dame parents who have instigated a consultation on the school's status as an all-girls school – the consultation will go ahead as from 18th March until May 2019 (more info at next PC meeting)</p> <p>Sylvia agreed to contact them to ask re this.</p> <p>Post-meeting note: Bridge the Gap have agreed to attend the next Christmas Fayre and run a workshop (they will have a new programme PC/the school can select from)</p>
