Item	To do
1. School Captains Declan and Sarah - introduced themselves and their role in the Pupils Council to Parent Forum - expressed their intention to work closely with Parent Council - are working on making the pupils of the school more visible through social media and putting the <i>Hillhead Highlights</i> online on the new school website - parents agreed to set up email communication with the captains to share issues/ideas/approaches and organise joint events	Sylvia to set up email communication
2. Agreeing minutes from previous PC meeting - Headteacher specifies that the school will organise an information evening on internet security for parents with the Wheeltrust and Craig Brooks from Police Scotland in February/March 2018	PC to advertise with parents
3. School Kit Policy / John Gemmill - John presented his approach to establishing pupils' preferences with regard to the school kit policy for PE through giving pupils a greater voice in a survey on this issue - the aim of the survey was to encourage pupils to wear an easily identifiable HHS PE kit more consistently and to promote a smart image - the findings of the survey, which included the views of 684 pupils, clearly highlighted a preference for a HHS dark T-Shirt to be worn with matching dark legwear - parents highly commended the efforts to gather pupils' views in this way and discussed the questions of the cost – it was agreed that the T-Shirt but not the legwear should carry the school logo	
4. Headteacher's report - will be attached separately - one item in the report was that Mr Richardson has produced a new version of the options booklet for the subject choice in S3. The booklet was sent to pupil and teacher reps and the PC will give feedback as well. - the Parent Council also commends the school's initiative to involve all teachers in Teacher Learning Communities across the school with a focus on improving the teaching and learning in the school, specifically addressing pedagogy and equity. The groups meet several times a year and aim at embedding consistent approaches to formative assessment in the school. This addresses concerns expressed by parents with regard to consistency in and amount of assessment, especially in the senior phase.
