University UCAS Applications



26th November- Complete the additional information section and choices section online. Return predicted grades and comment forms to Pastoral Care teachers.

Personal Statement Feedback- Any pupil wishing to receive feedback on their Personal Statement should email it to Mr Richardson who will share with our partners, FOCUS West for expert feedback.



College Applications



All school leavers at Hillhead High School should complete a college application, even if university, apprenticeship or employment is their first choice. This ensures that everyone has a back-up options, in case things do not go to plan.

December - College applications for those currently attending a college course or undertaking a Foundation Apprenticeship will open in December. It is vital that pupils take advantage of this early access as it will increase their chances of gaining a place at college.



Mid January- Applications for all other leavers will open around the 15th of January (exact date to be confirmed by the colleges). Pupils should be ready to submit their application as close to this date as possible, as places are offered to suitable applicants on a first come first serve basis. Pupils should have their 2000 character personal statement completed and checked prior to this date. Mr Richardson will send out more information on support sessions for writing college applications soon.

Apprenticeships

28th February 2022- Apprenticeship applications for BAE Systems for August 2022 start are now open and close on the 28th of February.

Level 6 Leadership Award



All S6 pupils are undertaking the SQA Level 6 Leadership Award this year.

This is to allow all pupils the opportunity to gain a Higher-level qualification and to recognise the hard work and effort put into S6 committees. From the 19th of November pupils have met in their committee groups during Friday 5. The S6 Leadership Team began the award a few weeks ago and have been providing support to their peers. As well as developing key skills through their committees, such as teamwork, problem solving and communication, gaining one or more level 6 qualifications provides more opportunities to our pupils upon leaving school.

Duke of Edinburgh's Award

Over the past three months all S6 pupils have been offered the opportunity to undertake the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award. This is fully funded by the school with all equipment available to pupils who need it. Over 100 S6 pupils have completed their expedition sections which is an incredible achievement. Pupils should now focus on completing their Physical, Skill and Volunteering sections and keeping evidence of this through photographs or a logbook.
