New PC Members Election

- 5 spots available as another 2 PC leavers:
 - Annabel head of PACE joined autumn 2019/Feb 2020 really strong group, able to make a difference; stepping down for personal reasons
 - Karen: on PC for at least 5-6 years, delighted to see new faces joining the PC, gives lots of representation to the community;
 Catriona is an amazing chair; stepping down but not away, will support PC as much as possible

Chair Comment: Massive thank you to Annabel for setting up and driving eco agenda in PACE, and Karen for her support over the years

- Democratic voting will come up automatically via Zoom: 5 questions, one for each of the 5 people standing for election
 - Sandra: children in S1 and S4, co-opted in Jun-21, involved in PACE, involved at primary school PC, took over 2nd hand uniforms at HH Primary school; good to drive eco agenda and 2nd hand uniform at HHS
 - Sam: child in S1, found school community to be brilliant, would like to make more contribution, give back to community, multicultural aspect, would love to help develop that, help facilitate, healthy communication
 - Valentina: from Russia, husband Albanian, son in S2, daughter about to start S1, moved from London in 2020, during lockdown, found community very helpful, very welcoming, wants to contribute and be useful, to be more part of the community
 - Kiki: child in S1, keen to be involved, was on PC in primary school, good way to know the culture, community, what could be different, better around school community; often curious of families who can't speak up or not as loud as others, etc; trying to understand needs that are not being met in the periphery of school community; promotes being curious about difference within the school; wants to be part of school community
 - o Ram: from India, good to see multicultural environment, child in S2, son at St Patrick's primary, hoping to join HHS too; Ram is also part of PC in St Patrick and was also part of PC in India; consultant in Banking; outreach, always hands on, to see how students develop, not just his children; works remotely, does his own schedule, can work and help with PC; will be attending every PC, whether member or not
- Encouraging to see parents of S1s joining, very inspirational to hear new parents' reasons for wanting to join, new faces, welcome everyone
- Poll open: voting for 5 people for 5 spaces
- Poll closed: all 5 new members now elected with 100% of the votes

- School improvement plan, 3 priorities:
 - Learning and teaching, digital learning, national priority

- Free bus travel:

- School uniform:
 - On-going reminders through tannoy, newsletter, etc., however school is supportive if pupils come in w/o uniform, depending on family circumstances
 - Shoes: black shoes are part of the school uniform not as strict, not making a big deal for this year following lockdown, however will push for black shoes in new term/year
- Lot of people have signed up to Groupcall very positive as helping communication to Parent Forum

Phone Calls Parents Evenings – Mr Jack Richardson

- S3, 5 and 6 happened so far, with S2 scheduled for tomorrow, S4 on 22-Feb, S1s on 01-Mar
- Well received, feedback pretty user friendly, easy for staff
- Process:
 - o Letter sent out to Parents/carers, bookings system open for a week, either pick times or system assigns it
 - Teachers phone parents 5mn slot
 - o Interpreters can be booked, via Ms Gostanska, 3-way conf call (double slot appts for that)
- If anyone has any system issue, phone school office, they can override
- Parents/Carers can speak to each subject teacher
- Recommendation is to prioritise teachers of interest subjects if there are many teachers to see
- HT will gather feedback from PC, Parents and staff on this year's system

HT Comments:

• Thank you Jack for the hard work setting these up

- 5 minute slots which are the same as in-person slots, helps meeting be focused, 28 appts per teacher (almost every pupil in a class of 30), if we were to increase slots, less parents/carers would get to speak to teachers
- All teachers have the same number of appts
- Get in touch with school if any issue
- Parents/Carers attendance better than F2F, broadly the same, more attendance in S3 due to options, S6 due to exams.
- When survey comes out, ensure to complete it.
- If any issue, contact PC teacher

Fundraising Sub=group - PC Member Bernie, Astrid and Sandra

- Bernie and Astrid started work on quiz night for parents/carers + staff plan so far:
 - On Friday 06-May
 - o 19:15 22:30
 - o At Hughenden (Bernie can get us the place for free)
 - o 120 capacity, open to parents/staff who want to go
 - o Small table size prob 5
 - Cost: £8 / ticket for entrance (bar available)
 - Ticketless, maybe through FB/Twitter
 - o Payment via money transfer, will advertise, so no money exchanging hands
- Could also have raffle
- Fundraiser to fund school minibus (unsure how much life left existing one has, which would take priority, needs to be on promotion
- Long road ahead, as new minibus = £30k excl VAT (2nd hand £12-13k)
- Taking steps in right direction, taking direction from HT on school priorities, as other projects suggested: extension to bike shed; garden furniture to the left of the entrance of school, £1500-2000; so whole variety of options, however Minibus gives lot of options and DoE programme would suffer from lack of transport
- Need to keep going, if you know some generous benefactors, please reach out.
