Hillhead Habits of Learning and Belonging

S6 pupils are role models for younger year groups and help set the tone for the rest of the school in terms of positive habits. At Hillhead, we believe in instilling the following:

- Quality **Learning Time** maximising time in class
- Positive **Learning Quality** maximising focus in class
- Being Part of the Team feeling a sense of belonging and pride in our school community

Full school uniform (white shirt, blue tie, black trousers or skirt) is essential in fostering a sense of belonging in our school community. Enforcing a low-cost school uniform is inclusive and minimises pressure on pupils to wear expensive designer clothing.

As well as this visible sign of leadership, all S6 pupils will join committees this year which are designed to support school identity and community. This work will not only support the wider life of















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the school develop key skills, it will also give the opportunity for all pupils to obtain their Level 6 SQA Leadership Award. Pupils will sign up to committees following an assembly this week.

Timekeeping and attendance are imperative in ensuring that learning time is maximised. All S6 pupils are required to attend registration each morning at 8.54am to find out essential information as well as opportunities. If we have concerns about attendance, letters will be sent out my Pastoral Care teachers to communicate this and support us all working together to support your child.

<u>Financial Information</u>

While we work hard to minimise the cost of the school day for all pupils, any payments (e.g for prom, ties) must be made to the school via ParentPay. More information on ParentPay can be found here: https://blogs.glowscotland.org.uk/gc/hillheadhigh/shop/

S6 pupils may be entitled to a monthly payment through the Educational Maintenance Allowance (EMA). Details of criteria and how to apply for EMA have been posted on the S6 Teams page.

We also have a Financial Inclusion Support Officer (FISO) who is available to provide free advice regarding finances. This includes entitlements such as EMA, Free School Meals and school clothing grants. Examinations and Supports

The 2024 SQA exam diet starts on Monday 22 April and finishes on Thursday 30 May. The full exam timetable is due to be published by the end of August.

To support with the examinations, S6 Evidence Gathering will take place this year from Monday 29th January to Friday 16th February. Time is also built into this period for mop-up due to absence as well as supporting the completion of the Level 6 Leadership Award.

As ever, there will be a huge amount of academic support available to young people throughout S6. The school's supported study timetable is always comprehensive and will be shared in due course. In the meantime, eSgoil (https://www.e-sgoil.com/) and WestOS (https://www.westpartnership.co.uk/west-os/) offer live and recorded sessions that are available now.















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Leaving School

A lot of work goes into helping prepare our pupils for leaving school. A great deal of support from the Pastoral Care and Pathways Teams to ensure they pupils are ready for life after Hillhead High School. UCAS, college and modern apprenticeship deadlines will be shared in the coming months. We will be hosting an information evening (date to follow) which will cover the range of supports that are available, as well as provide information about the application process for college, university, employment and apprenticeships.
