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Hillhead High Uniform Items and Clothing

Free/New Recycled Uniform and Clothing Store

The school has a store of uniform and casual clothing which is accessible free of charge. This is part of our initiative to become more sustainable, and we have good quality second hand uniform stock available, as well as other clothing including jackets, shoes, school bags etc. We also have a wide range of brand new clothing. This is all free of charge and can be accessed without question.

Resources Support

We have stationery, study materials, school bags, textbooks and study guides available for pupils who may benefit from these resources. All pupils are given an ipad and every year our new S1 pupils are given a settling in pack of resources.




Our FISO has helped a number of Hillhead High families to claim a range of benefits and/or support with debt management.

Below are the supports families have received in total between April 2021 and September 2023










Free School Meals and Clothing Grant





Free School Meals

Your child may be entitled to free school meals. If your child receives free school meals, you may also be eligible for support during the school holidays. Please see the below link for more information and how to apply.

Clothing Grant

Families on low incomes may be eligible to receive a School Clothing Grant award of £120 for a Primary aged child or £150 for a Secondary aged child. The award is given annually to assist with the cost of purchasing essential school clothing for families who are on a qualifying benefit.

Under 22 Free Travel Scheme

Led by The Scottish Government, young people in Scotland aged under 22 years old are entitled to free bus travel.

- To access the scheme you must apply for a new National Entitlement Card (NEC) card.
- Those aged between 5-15 must have a parent, guardian, or carer apply for a new NEC card on their behalf. Those aged between 16-21 should apply themselves.
- It's important that you apply for your new NEC Card in order to access the travel scheme, as old Young Scot Cards will not be accepted, and you will be required to pay your fare as normal.

Prom can be an expensive event for families. We have ensured the cost of prom ticket has been kept low and decided it was very important to keep the cost of prom outfits low too. In the month of May 2022, Miss King and our S6 Prom Committee set up a Prom Boutique for S6 pupils to come along and experience the fun of trying on prom items with their friends - without the cost! As a result of generous donations from our school community we had a range of prom clothing and accessories that could be borrowed free of charge. If any items were donated and not borrowed that year, they were kept for the following year. The event was very successful, therefore we ran it again in Spring 2023.

We will be looking for donations again in Spring 2024, so please keep your prom outfits and if you have anything you would like to donate, we will send information out nearer the time. We will take donations of outfits, shoes, bags, jewellery and hairpieces.
