MENTORS IN VIOLENCE PREVENTION

Our school participates in the Mentors in Violence Prevention (MVP) program—an innovative initiative designed to empower young people to become leaders in promoting respectful relationships and preventing bullying, harassment, and violence.

Through engaging discussions and scenario-based learning, MVP encourages students to think critically about real-life situations and equips them with practical strategies to safely intervene as active bystanders. The programme fosters empathy, confidence, and a strong sense of responsibility, helping pupils build a safer and more inclusive school community.

Our trained student mentors from S4 will be working with S1 pupils to lead sessions, model positive behaviour, and support others in making respectful choices.

PERSONAL AND SOCIAL EDUCATION

During the 2024/25 session, we have redeveloped our Personal and Social Education (PSE) curriculum to ensure that it reflects modern life, builds pupils' life skills and resilience, and meets the needs of our Hillhead community.

The redesign has been a collaborative process involving pupils from all year groups, staff from across departments, and parents, who shared their views in focus groups held in January and February 2025. Their input has helped shape a programme that is relevant, engaging, and meaningful for our young people.

Curriculum Structure

The new curriculum is structured around four key themes explored by every year group:

- 1. Habits for Learning developing positive learning behaviours and retrieval skills
- 2. Habits for Belonging fostering inclusion, respect, and a sense of community.
- 3. Habits for Work preparing pupils with the skills needed for future pathways.
- 4. Habits for Life focusing on wellbeing, safety, and making responsible choices.

Focus on Safety and Risk Awareness

Within the Habits for Life unit, pupils focus on understanding and managing risk, both at home and in the wider community. Topics such as substance misuse, relationships and sexual health, online safety, and crime prevention are explored progressively, revisiting and building upon previous learning as pupils move through school.


Each year group concludes the unit with two key lessons on Evaluating Risk:

- 1. Hazard Perception pupils analyse scenarios to identify potential risks and how to avoid them.
- 2. Mistakes pupils reflect on situations where poor decisions have led to risk or harm, exploring how to seek help and the support services available.

Next Steps

This year, our new curriculum is being piloted and evaluated through ongoing pupil and staff feedback to ensure it continues to evolve and meet the needs of our learners.

At Hillhead, we are committed to helping every pupil develop the knowledge, confidence, and resilience to stay safe, supported, and ready for life.









S1 IPADS




ADVANCED HIGHER CHEMISTRY






ENGLISH DEPARTMENT


