## STAFFING UPDATE

We welcome Mr Stephen Frame, our new Depute Headteacher (P1-P3). Mr Frame has already been getting to know our children and families and is enjoying being a part of our staff team. We are also delighted that just before the summer we got confirmation that Mrs Anna Timms has been made a permanent member of our teaching staff. Mrs Timms will be teaching Primary 4A this year. Ms Moir will continue to cover Mrs McFadyen's maternity leave and Mrs Campbell and Mrs MacQuarrie will be providing learning support, covering the long term absence of Ms Mclaughlin. As part of our Pupil Equity Funding, Mrs MacNicol will be supporting pupils across the school and Mrs Wynn has been appointed as our Pupil Equity Fund PT. This means that Primary 5A will now be taught by Mrs Wynn (Mon, Tues and Wed mornings) and Ms Chambers (Wednesday afternoons, Thursdays and Fridays)

## ATTENDANCE AND LATECOMING

A reminder that attendance and being at school on time are vital in ensuring your child can progress in their learning. In particular, children arriving at school late can mean they are missing important teaching and learning time. Can all parents/carers support us by ensuring that your child is at school for 09.00 am. ## SCHOOL LUNCHES AND BREAKFAST CLUB

Breakfast Club is £2 per day (if you have more than one child, the others pay £1) open 8am until 8.40am through the glass doors. **(A reminder that there is NO playground supervision before 8.45am and we therefore recommend that pupils are not left in the playground prior to this time.)** School lunches are free for all P1-3 pupils and £1.90 for pupils in P4-7. Free school meal applications can be made through Glasgow City Council Website and applications should be renewed every year before October. We are also in the process of re-issuing our lunch cards for pupils that have school lunches on a regular basis.

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## TRAFFIC ISSUES

Despite the introduction of the one-way system, we are continuing to have problems with drivers parking on the yellow zig-zags at the entrance of the school. We have also had several incidents with parents displaying aggressive and intimidating behaviour in front of our pupils. Can we ask that any issues related to illegal parking or dangerous driving be reported to the local police station and a member of the Senior Leadership Team.



## CELEBRATING ACHIEVEMENT

Last session we launched our 'Celebrating Achievement' walls in order for pupils to share and celebrate their wider achievements. Pupils are invited to bring in their certificates /medals/trophies and have their photographs taken. They will be asked to write a sentence or two about the talent or skill that they have been developing and this success will be shared with their classmates and displayed for others to see. We look forward to celebrating the children's successes both 'in and out' of school.

On Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> August P1 – P3 enjoyed an assembly from the SPCA, with all of our P4-P7 classes enjoying class visits on various topics, including: The Responsibilities of Pet Ownership and Animal Safety. Children participated enthusiastically in playing games, presentations and question and answer sessions. Thanks to our colleagues at SPCA for taking the time to come along and visit our school.

## P1 PARENT WORKSHOPS

## CLASS TRIPS



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## P6/P7 RESIDENTIAL TRIPS

These trips allow our pupils to engage in a variety of team-building and outdoor learning experiences, as well as providing opportunities for pupils to develop their skills for learning, work and life. ### ACTIVE SCHOOLS

Mr O'Mara, our Active Schools Co-ordinator will no longer be based within the school. He along with the rest of the Active Schools Team are located centrally at Cleveden Secondary. However, Mr O'Mara will still work very closely with the school and continue to support our variety of coaches and clubs. He will still visit the school on a regular basis and will very much remain, a valued member of our school community.

### TERM 1 - BREAKFAST/ LUNCHTIME/AFTER SCHOOL SPORT CLUBS

We have 13 extra-curricular clubs on offer in Term 1. Letters have already been issued and some of our clubs are already up and running. Most clubs have a maximum of 20 spaces and places are offered on a first come, first served basis. If a pupil does not get a space on a club, their name is added to a reserve list and they will be given priority when the next club for that stage is offered. As well as a group of coaches, a number of our teachers are leading clubs both at lunchtime and after school, we thank them sharing their expertise and giving up their time to facilitate these experiences for our pupils.
