Dear Parent/Carers

A very warm welcome to our first newsletter of 2018. We hope that you had a pleasant winter break and are looking forward to another exciting term ahead. We had a very busy month in December, including: P1-P3 Christmas Show, Christmas Fair and our Christmas Celebration. It was lovely to see so many of you attend these events and once again thank you for all your kind contributions and on-going support. Outlined below are a list of upcoming activities and events and a reminder of diary dates for this term.

## STAFFING UPDATE

We are delighted to welcome back Mrs McFadyen who will be teaching Primary 6A every Monday and Tuesday. Ms Leslie will continue to teach the class every Wednesday – Friday. Unfortunately and out with our control, Ms Moir has been redeployed to another school in the North of the city. We want to take this opportunity to thank Ms Moir for all of her hard work and wish her well in her new post. This also means that this term our P4 and P7 classes will now be working on Science and Technologies with Mrs Campbell, whilst Mrs McFadyen will cover these curricular areas with both P6 classes and P5B.

## PARTNERSHIP WORKING

Our P5A class are about to undertake a block of Drama workshops delivered by the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. The pupils will be working in small groups on a number of drama techniques and will be delivering a performance for their peers. This is a great opportunity for our pupils to further extend their expressive arts skills. P5B recently received a block of Sports Leadership Coaching from Sports Ambassadors at Hyndland Secondary. The pupils worked in groups to further enhance their ability to work in teams as well as developing specific sporting skills. A big thanks to the S5/S6 pupils and the P.E Department at Hyndland Secondary for providing this experience and we look forward to further collaboration involving our newly elected Sports Councillors. Also, we are delighted to embark about a Science and Technology initiative working in partnership with the University of Strathclyde and the Young Engineers Project. All of our P4-P7 classes will be working on a STEM project this session, working with Postgraduate Engineering students. The project will conclude with some pupils being invited to present at a National Conference at the University in the summer term.

## P4-P7 LEARNING JOURNEYS

## **PUPIL VOICE**

A big congratulations to all of the pupils that applied for both our Sports Council and Digital Leaders. It was great to see the pupils demonstrate such enthusiasm and the high degree of skills demonstrated during the interview process. Our newly elected Sports Council have already played a role in deciding what stages certain clubs are offered to this term and they are about to embark upon creating surveys and gathering the views of their classmates on clubs for Term 4. Some of our Sports council will also be further extending their leadership skills by organising and running some pupil-lead lunchtime clubs in the coming weeks. Our Digital Leaders will now work with Mrs McFadyen on a Wednesday afternoon and their first task will be to help update our school website. Also, as we begin our initial journey towards becoming a Rights Respecting School, Rights Ambassadors have been elected from each class (P4-P7) These pupils will work with Mr Gibson to help develop and lead the rest of the school in exploring and understanding the Rights of the Child.

Last term we issued pupils with an Assembly survey to gather their views and opinions on what they enjoy about assemblies, what improvements could be made and what topics/themes they would like to learn about.

**Pupil feedback was that they enjoyed:**

- Learning and singing songs
- Maths Challenges
- Discussing School Values
- School News – weekly update
- First Minister’s Reading Challenge
- House Challenges

**Pupils thought that we could improve assemblies by:**

- Revisiting some ‘older’ songs
- More opportunities for pupils to lead assembly
- Reintroduction of Talent Spot
- More House Challenges



**Pupils would like:**

- Spelling Challenges and more Maths Challenges
- Themes topics they would like to learn more about included: Countries, Famous Scientists, History and Animals.

These findings were shared with pupils at assembly and we will incorporate the feedback into the planning of assemblies for Terms 3 and 4.

## P6/P7 TRANSITIONS



Both P6 and P7 classes will be undertaking Expressive Arts and Interdisciplinary Learning projects with Hyndland Secondary this term. Our P6 classes will be working with Ms Rennie (Music Department) for a four week block. This is the third year of this project, with the pupils creating and performing their compositions at Hyndland Secondary in March. On Friday the 5<sup>th</sup> February our P7 pupils will be attending a Burns Supper at Hyndland Secondary as part of a Learning Community Transition event. They will be performing Scots Poetry/songs and participating in some Scottish Country Dancing as well as enjoying a traditional Burns supper.

### P6 MILLPORT RESIDENTIAL TRIP

Our P6 classes will be embarking upon a one night residential trip to FSC Millport on **Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> to Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> March**. Packs will be coming home next week with information about the centre and activities, alongside consent forms and medical administration forms. These forms should be completed and returned to the school office for **Friday 9<sup>th</sup> February 2018**. Any outstanding balances are also due by this date.

### P7 DOUNANS RESIDNETIAL TRIP

Our P7 pupils will be visiting Dounans Outdoor Education Centre week beginning Monday 23rd April for five days. There will be a parent/carer information evening held just after the February break (date to be confirmed) The Centre Manager will give a presentation detailing an overview of the trip, activities, food, accommodation etc. alongside a question and answer session. At this meeting you will be issued with a pack containing important consent forms, medical administration records and any other relevant information regarding the trip. These forms should be completed and returned to the school office by no later than **Friday 9<sup>th</sup> March 2018**. Any outstanding balances are also due by this date.

### GLASGOW COUNTS

As part of our School Improvement Focus this session, we have been introducing aspects of Glasgow City Council's Mathematics Framework: Glasgow Counts. This research based approach places strong emphasis on the use of the concrete, pictorial, abstract approach. As a school, we have been working on developing a Maths Mind-set and introducing pupils to a variety of strategies to solve problems and carry out calculations, including use of concrete materials, pictorial representations, the empty number-line and the bar model. This means that your child's maths jotter should now contain a range of different type of calculations and that whilst there is still a place for use of algorithms (traditional sums) we are looking to equip our young people with an extended strategy toolkit. We will be sending home a short leaflet with further explaining these approaches within the next few weeks. We also intend to run an information station about Glasgow Counts at both our Open afternoon and Parents' Evenings later on this term.

### SCOTTISH POETRY COMPETITION



This year our Scottish Poetry Competition Final will take place on **Friday 26<sup>th</sup> January** in our school gym hall. All of our pupils have been working very hard both in class and at home on their poems and songs in preparation for this event. Due to limited space restrictions, only parents/carers of our finalists will be invited to attend. Thank you to all staff, pupils and parents for their effort and hard work.

### P3-P7 MATILDA: THE MUSICAL

This term we are offering the opportunity for pupils from P3-P7 to participate in an exciting After School club with a focus on Art, Music and Drama to produce an abridged performance of Matilda. Pupils will be working as: musicians, actors and stage artists, allowing them to develop their skills and showcase their talents in a fun and exciting context. All of their effort and hard work will then be on display when they perform the show for parents and carers just prior to the spring break.
