Literacy & English	<ul> <li>Throughout the year, through group teaching and play activities, learning in literacy will focus on –</li> <li>Weekly phonics (single sounds and then moving on to sounds made up of more than one letter e.g. 'th')</li> <li>Weekly common/ high frequency words (words which are necessary for reading and writing, and may not be phonetic)</li> <li>Shared reading – daily opportunities to enjoy, share and respond to quality texts in the classroom (variety of themes and genres linked to topics and reflecting pupil interests)</li> <li>Guided reading – regular opportunities to read individually, or in small groups, using a levelled text</li> <li>Opportunities to write for a specific purpose – in response to a text, as part of a topic, to share with others</li> <li>Opportunities to learn and practise letter formation through sensory play experiences and teacher-led activities (focus comes from phonics taught, initially)</li> <li>Regular opportunities to write in teacher directed activities; as well as self directed, during play.</li> </ul>
