Please see below some optional activities for your children to complete on Friday the 24<sup>th</sup> of January. You are welcome to post them to Seesaw once completed.

<p>Choose a character from a fairytale, cartoon or game. Think of some things they might say in different situations. Draw a picture of the character with three different speech bubbles coming out of their mouth. Write three different things they might say, one in each speech bubble. Now choose a new character and draw a new picture. This time, instead of speech bubbles, write the direct speech the character would say inside speech marks. Write the three different pieces of speech under your picture of your new character. Don't forget to put your speech marks round the direct speech.</p>	<p>Go on a symmetry hunt around your house, making a list of as many objects as you can you find that have at least one line of symmetry. Draw each object and write beside it what it is. Then make a note of how many lines of symmetry each object has. Get someone to look at your list of symmetrical objects when you are finished. Get them to guess how many lines of symmetry each one has. Are they right?</p>	<p>Be kind to others. Make a list of 3 acts of kindness you could show each day for a week to someone else. If you're feeling really kind and thoughtful, you could try and make a list for a whole month!</p>
<p>Write a short story with the title 'Adventures in ? land!' It could be a candyland, fluffyland, mudland, dinosaurland, the choice is yours! Make sure you include an interesting character and lots of describing words. Remember your capital letters and full stops.</p>	<p>Think about the journey you usually take from your house to school. Write a list of directions for someone to follow so they can arrive in the correct place. Try to use instructions which include directions from a compass. For example, Leave the house and turn west, walk south etc. Can you make a map to show the way? Give the map to someone to read. Can they make it to the destination using your directions? Use google maps to help you. Zoom in on the area which includes your house and the school.</p>	<p>Help out around the house. Make a list of 3-5 chores you do every day to help your family. Think of some things that are easy for you to remember to do but which will really make a difference to the people in your house.</p>
<p>Read a non-fiction book.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• AFTER reading, write 5 facts you have found in the book.</li> <li>• Design a new front cover for your book.</li> </ul>	<p>Find 5 different 2D and 5 3D shapes around your home. Record the number of faces, sides, edges and vertices (corners) each shape has. Draw a picture using at least eight of the shapes you found.</p>	<p>Research 10 key facts about volcanoes, earthquakes or tsunamis. Use the information you find to help you design and make a board game, card game or memory game.</p>
