<p>Story Starter – Use this as an opener to a story. Think about the Vocabulary, Connective, Openers and Punctuation you are using to create a quality piece of writing.</p> <p>Everything stopped. Everything a statue all around me. Frozen in time.</p>	<p>Table Master – Master your seven times table so that any question can be fired at you at any time and you know the answer within 2 seconds! If you can already do this, try learning your seven times table up to 20! Why stop there? Go the 'extra mile' and do the same for the 8 and 9x tables.</p>	<p>True Stories - Go on the BBC Teach website and click on the Primary - History – True Stories section. You will find a series of short films looking at significant people from history who changed their world and impacted how we live today. Watch at least 6 of these short films. Select the person who interests you the most, carry out a little research and then and write and illustrate a biography of them.</p>
<p>Lifetime Tale in Pictures - Draw the main character from a book you have recently read. Show them as a baby, middle aged and as an older person. Underneath each picture explain what they might be doing at that point of their life and why. If you are stuck for a book to use, then why not select somebody from your in class reading novel.</p>	<p>My Home – using a ruler or measuring tape, work out the perimeter of the different rooms in your house. Use this information to also work out the area to the nearest sq.m. Now draw a floor map of your home. As an extra challenge why not look at some house schedules online and write one for your home.</p>	<p>Sell It – imagine that you are a publicist for one of your favourite books. Write and then delivers a 60-second speech that will persuade others that they should read this book. Try and use some of the persuasive writing skills we have been learning. Film your speech on your iPad and share it with us when we return to school.</p>
<p>Beautiful Writing – Find a poem, story or part of a book that you really like. Write this out as beautifully as you can in order to practise your handwriting skills. You may wish to add a beautifully detailed border to your page. Why not go the extra mile and see if you can select a poem or other piece of text which has a Robert Burns theme?</p>	<p>Sumdog – complete the Sumdog challenge assigned to you.</p>	<p>Robert Burns – tomorrow is Robert Burns Day, research why he has become an important figure and why we celebrate on this day? Can you learn one of his poems?</p>
