Spelling – use your spelling words (these should be in your homework jotter or on Seesaw) to create some silly sentences, a story, poem, song or rap.	Probability – record six different situations in pictures and/or words and then put them in order of their probability. Remember to use the language of probability. Try to ask open questions – ones where he would give full answers, as well as closed ones. You can also vary sentence structure by starting with different opening phrases.	Time - Create a timeline of WWII and include key events such as Neville Chamberlain quitting and Germany surrendering. You could create it on a fold out timeline, on the computer or in your jotter.	Technology- design a game on Scratch, or any gaming platform that is suitable for your age, that helps people learn something. Writing – Create a diary about your time off, it could be written on paper, as a movie/animation or a book if you wish.	Multiplication – Select a times table.
