QS Exam results and post results support

As you will be aware all senior phase learners will receive their QS exam results on Tuesday 4th August.

Exam certificates will be delivered to homes via the royal mail. Learners can also register to receive their results by both text and email – we would strongly encourage learners to do this via the 'My Qualifications Scotland' page via the QS website.

Upon the receipt of results, **if a young person wishes to amend their options based upon results, they should complete the glow form that will be posted in their year group team and on the school website.**

House Teams will be in school on 5th August to make phone calls to young people and families. If they require a call, they should complete the glow form that will be posted in the year group team.

Appeals

If you have concerns about a grade (or grades) on your results certificate, you can use the free appeals service. You can appeal directly to Qualification Scotland or ask the school to do this for you.

The service will open on results day, Tuesday 4 August at 9 am, and the learner direct submission deadlines are:

- Tuesday 11 August at 11.59 pm for priority appeals
- Tuesday 25 August at 11.59 pm for all other appeals

If you appeal through the school, the deadlines are:

- Thursday 20 August at 5 pm for priority appeals
- Friday 28 August at 5 pm for all other appeals

You can ask for a priority appeal but **only** if you have a conditional place at university or college, or in training or employment that depends on your grade.

How does the Appeals Service work?

You should only appeal if you believe a mistake has been made in the external marking of your work. You should speak to your 'House Team' before submitting an appeal via Learners Direct.

If you do appeal your grade, a senior marker will carry out a marking review of your Qualifications Scotland-marked assessments. This means that they'll review your answers to all questions and assignments marked by us. They check that the marks awarded by the original marker are in line with the marking standards agreed at the markers' briefing and the marking instructions.

In addition, they also check that:

- all parts of your Qualifications Scotland assessments have been marked;
- the marks given for each answer have been added correctly; and
- the correct result has been entered on our system.

Please note that after being reviewed, your result could **stay the same**, go **up** or go **down**.
