Parents Dropping off children

It has been brought to my attention that many parents are not 'physically distancing' themselves' at the entrances/exits to the school and also blocking the gates when collecting their children. Can I please remind you that:

You need to stay outside the gates -this allows staff to see parents and they can send their child/ren to them, and also it allows adults who work in the school to exit the premises.

I am going to add more signs after the holidays - made by the pupils in Primary 7, that highlight the need to keep our distance.

Safety Concerns

Can I please remind you that pupils are still **not**allowed to bring toys, cards or anything other than
essential items such as lunchboxes, school bags or
reading books to school. We have systems in place
to manage these essential items but this results in
children sharing items that have been brought in from
home that are not allowed. Sorry.

A gentle reminder—I have been dealing with a high volume of minor cuts and bumps recently and this has been a result of 'rough play'. This is not deliberate but it is leading to pupils being hurt. Please remind your child to be gentle. Thanks.

We continue to monitor attendance at Ibrox but appreciate in the current climate some families may be anxious about their child returning to school.

Lunches and Breakfast Club

Many of you will be aware of the new payment system for lunch and breakfast club in school. This involves families paying in advance using BACS. The school has sent Glasgow City Councils bank details along with pupils individual reference number to families.

* Please remember that Ibrox Primary continues to be a 'nut free' and 'health promoting school'. As more and more pupils bring a packed lunch to school it is being brought to my attention that pupils are bringing cakes and packets of biscuits as a lunch. If you are finding it difficult to provide a suitable lunch for your child, please contact the school to see if we can offer any support with this.

Homework

After some discussions with staff, it has been agreed that alongside reading books that are sent home and then quarantined on return. Homework will be provided by class teachers on a weekly basis. This will not look exactly the same in each class and is dependant on the learning they are covering in class. Due to COVID reasons this will be marked alongside the children in the room and feedback given in class. Work will not be sent back for parents to comment on.
