Digital Update

- This month we have continued to move forward with our Digital Learning, with Primary 7 having their 1:1 iPads deployed. All children in P7 completed the basic training and parents engaged to complete home user agreements. The iPads are now able to support learning in class and can go home too. As part of Glasgow City Council Digital Inclusion fund all families were asked about whether they had devices and Wi-Fi at home. Across the city demand was greater than need and we have been allocated fewer devices then we require.
- Families who have NO Wi-Fi or NO device will be contacted in January and supplied with what they require where possible. The devices are due to arrive with us mid-January so I would hope to have these out by the end of the month. I have managed to ensure that all families will have at least one device to support and access learning at home. If you have any questions regarding Digital Learning please call the school office and ask for Mrs Chalmers.
